## **Museum Station Easier Access Project**

Phase 4 Construction Hoarding and Pedestrian Ramp on Queen's Park

#### Timeline:

Starting as early as October 20<sup>th</sup>, Phase 4 construction will begin on the east side of Queen's Park and is estimated to be completed in Q3 2026\*

\* Content/timeline accurate at the time of printing. Pending weather, unforeseen site conditions, and events.

#### What we are doing and why:

The TTC's Easier Access Program is making subway stations accessible. Major structural upgrades are underway at the concourse level to accommodate two new elevators, a new staircase, and an escalator—enhancing accessibility and passenger flow. Elevators are scheduled to be in service in Q3 2026\*.

Construction crews are reallocating the Phase 2 & 3 hoarding and installing a pedestrian detour ramp on the east side of Queen's Park in preparation for Phase 4. The pedestrian detour will replace the section of sidewalk that will be closed for construction. Hoarding and detours will remain on the west side of Queen's Park. Detour signage will be in place.

This work is necessary as part of the Museum Station Easier Access Project.

### What to expect:

- Major construction activities include shoring and excavation of elevator shafts
   – phased lane closures required.
- Work will typically take place Monday to Friday between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. Some work on weekends between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. may be required. For safety, overnight work may be required.
- Efforts will be made to keep disruption associated with noise and dust to a minimum
- Access to subway service will be maintained throughout construction.
- The north bike lane is expected to reopen by the end of 2025\*
- While the north entrances remain closed during concourse construction, customers can continue to use the new Queen's Park Circle entrance/exit.

Thank you for your patience as we continue to make Toronto Transit accessible.
