TTC streetcar track renewal at the King St. W. and Dufferin St. Intersection Delivery and storage of new streetcar rail panels

Timeline: September 27 to 28, 2025, overnight

Rail Delivery and Storage Details

On **Monday, September 29, 2025**, the City of Toronto and the TTC will begin renewal of the streetcar track at the intersection of King Street West and Dufferin Street. To support this work, the TTC will deliver new streetcar rail panels to the site between **11 p.m. and 5 a.m. on Saturday, September 27, and Sunday, September 28.**

The rail panels will be delivered on nine flat-deck trailers for eventual installation at the intersection. The flat-bed trailers will be parked in the centre lanes of the King Street West and Dufferin Street intersection (see the map on the reverse of this page). The flat-bed trailers will be removed once the new rail panels are installed.

Noise

- While crews will try to keep noise to a minimum during delivery, backup alarms on trucks and equipment will produce beeping sounds.
- Equipment lights will also be visible.

Travel and Parking Impacts

- East-west travel will be allowed while the flat-deck trailers are parked in the centre lanes on each leg of the King Street West and Dufferin Street intersection.
- Pay and display (metered) parking will not be permitted on any of the curb lanes next to where the flat-bed trailers are parked.
- Pay and display parking will be restored once the rail panels are installed and the trailers are removed from the site.

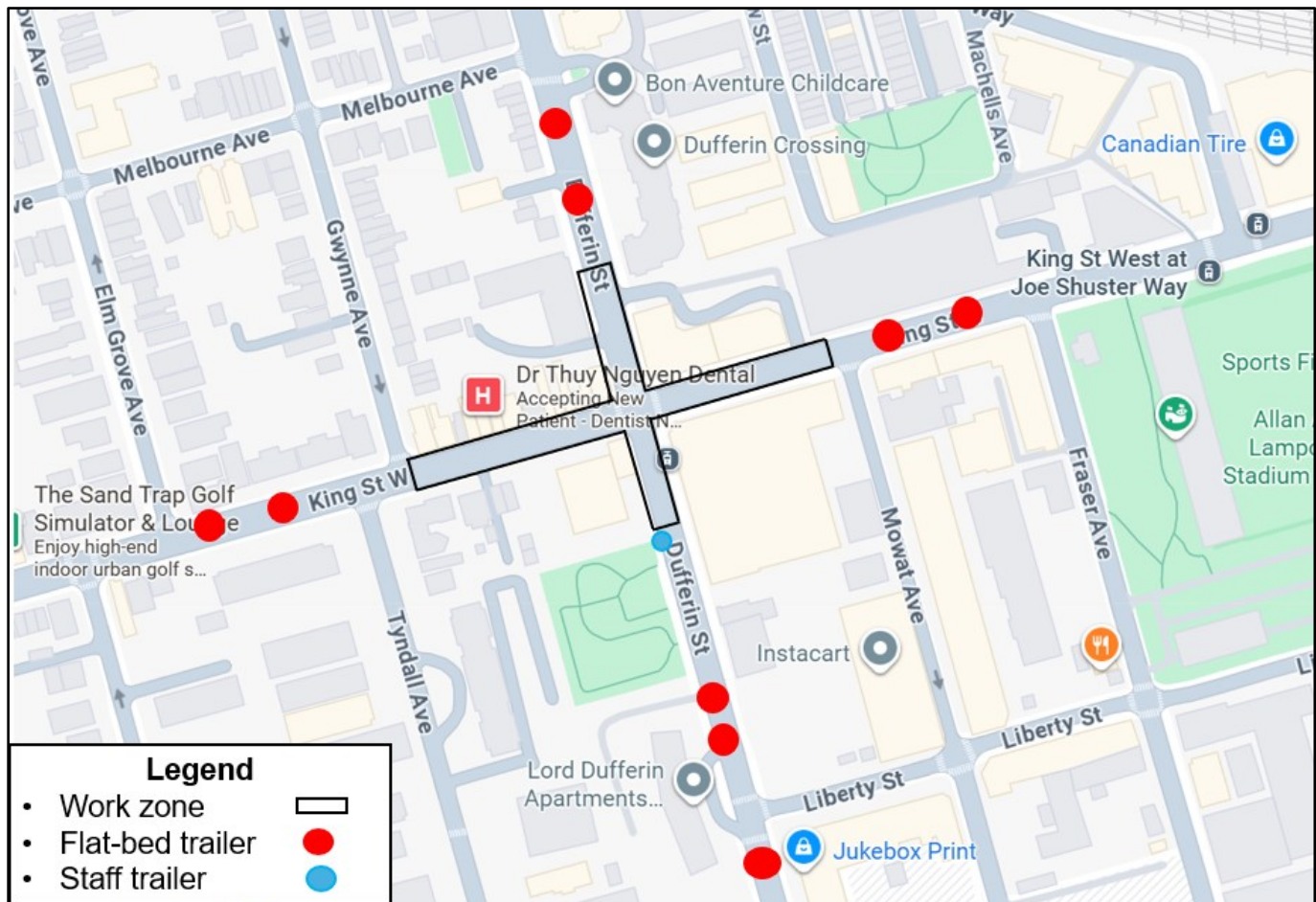
