We have provided responses in the attached comment tracker for your record. I've also included our response to comments 1 and 2 from Doris Chee below. If you think a meeting is necessary to discuss further, please let me

Response to Doris Chee's comments:

We understand Hydro One's concern with customers accessing the Tara Stop via the Gatineau Hydro Corridor Trail as it crosses beneath your infrastructure. Unlike other stops and/or stations on the TTC network (e.g. Finch Station with a large bus terminal and commuter parking lot beneath your hydro corridor) that bisect or remain beneath the existing Hydro One corridors, the anticipated daily ridership for this stop is significantly lower than other locations: 700 combined daily boardings/alightings. Given the stop's remote location without strong connections to other transit or arterial street network, including the fact the stop is surrounded by both open space and low density housing, ridership will continue to remain low.

Our intent with this stop is to serve the adjacent communities on the east and west sides of the rail corridor. Those residing on the east side of the corridor will use the Moorgate Bridge via Tara Ave to access the Gatineau Hydro Corridor Trail, using the trail for a distance of approximately 20m to connect to the stop. For those residing on the west side of the corridor, they will only cross the Gatineau Hydro Corridor Trail via Mooregate Ave, spanning a distance of approximately 5m along the trail.

In terms of providing other access opportunities outside of the Gatineau Hydro Corridor Trail, options are limited. The Stouffville GO Rail corridor is on the east side of the stop, to the north and south is the existing Line 3 corridor and future busway (along with HONI's and MX's infrastructure) – therefore access can only be accommodated from the west.

The TTC project team will continue to work with Hydro One to gain the necessary approvals to provide this connection, albeit a short one, via Gatineau Hydro Corridor Trail, and beneath your corridor.

As noted above, if the response provided is not acceptable, we would be happy to meet and discuss further.

Dear Dominic,

It was a pleasure to meet you yesterday at the TTC Open House for the proposed express busway lane.

As mentioned I am voicing on behalf of my neighborhood in Ellesmere LRT station. Since the closure of the Scarborough LRT line in Aug 2023, it caused inconvenience and time wasted to residence between Midland and Kennedy on Ellesmere Road.


- 1. Residence have to walk additional 5 to 10 mins on a steep climb, under summer heat or winter cold, to go onto Ellesmere road via the service road, before walking west towards Kennedy Road where amenities are located on Kennedy Commons (Metro, Foody World, Fast Foods). Imagine people who don't have a car and need to walk the extra distance 10mins with groceries in hand. We used to be able to access through the underpass at the Ellesmere LRT station, and cut short our travel time. See red & blue line on map.
- 2. Most buses coming back from Scarborough Town Centre, do not stop at the westbound bus-stop at the corner of Midland/Ellesmere going back to Kennedy station. Instead some buses go through the service road into Ellesmere station, and loop back out to Midland southbound bus-stop. This takes additional 10 mins unnecessary travel time (3 to 5mins to make the loop, another 5 mins to walk back to the Ellesmere LRT). See purple line on map.

Please look at the probable solution below.

- 1. Re-open the metal doors to the Ellesmere LRT station to allow residence to use the underpass. Board up or put "military grade barb wire fence" to seal the entry into the control/office booth and platform gates to prevent un-authorize trespassers. Install security cameras to deter intuders.
- 2. Allow all buses to stop at Midland/Ellesmere westbound bus-stop, and also stop at Ellesmere Station bus-stop for residence living there. (TTC shuttle buses always stop there, whenever the LRT trains are in-operable, I don't see why they cannot offer this service to the residence now). It is not going to slow down the travelling time of the buses by much since you have at least 8 buses going back to Kennedy Station.

Thank you for your feedback regarding the Line 3 Bus Replacement. The TTC is currently working on a proposal to convert the former Line 3 Right-of-Way (ROW) track area into a busway. This involves removal of the existing rail and signaling infrastructure and replacing it with an asphalt surface suitable for buses. This Busway would save customers from potentially stopping at 15 sets of traffic lights, and also allow the City to remove priority bus lanes along Kennedy Road and Midland Avenue. The priority bus lanes along Ellesmere Road would remain. The TTC intends to begin construction of the Busway in early-2025. Construction will take approximately two years to complete.

The decommissioning of the SRT line and the implementation of dedicated bus lanes, transit priority signals, and turn restrictions have been negatively impacting motorists in several ways since they were installed.

This has led to **increased congestion**, the dedicated bus lanes have reduced the space available for general traffic, leading to bottlenecks and increased congestion, particularly during peak hours. The turn restrictions have led to **limited access** in terms of routes available to motorists, making it more challenging to navigate the area and has increased travel times. Furthermore, transit priority signals give buses the right of way, which causes delays for motorists at intersections. When bus traffic is heavy, this leads to longer wait times for cars.

**Altering traffic patterns** has forced motorists to take longer detours or alternate routes, which has resulted in frustration and increased travel distances along with a massive increase in road rage incidents.

Road level bus lanes should not come at the expense of motorist convenience and accessibility, especially in Scarborough where the population is ever growing and getting extremely congested by the week. As a City we seem to be moving 10 years behind instead of being progressive, we're the laughing stock of western civilization when it comes to Transit.

Scarborough has constantly been getting shafted when it comes to transit. Great example is the Eglinton LRT. We need underground subway lines in Scarborough or above ground LRTs.

I would like to see all the bus lanes in Scarborough totally removed and to increase efficiency, install underground subways.

Overall, while these changes aim to improve transit efficiency, they have created significant challenges for motorists navigating the same roadways.

Hi Vidya,

Thank you for your e-mail. Ultimately, the decision to remove red bus lanes on Kennedy Road and Midland Avenue would need to be initiated by the City of Toronto and City Council.

Once the Busway is constructed, the 55 – 60 buses operating on Kennedy Road and Midland Road will decrease significantly. Kennedy Road will operate the 43 Kennedy Road bus, and Midland the 57 Midland bus. The additional eight routes will operate north-south using the dedicated corridor, away from local traffic. Ellesmere Road will maintain the bus lanes, because the Busway is only 4km in length, between Kennedy Station and Ellesmere Station.

There will be no construction on Kennedy Road or Midland Avenue to convert the Busway. We will be using the former Line 3 train track area. Existing traffic management on Kennedy Road and Midland Avenue will remain.

We anticipate the Busway taking two years to construct, and are planning to begin construction in early-2025, for an in-service date of early-2027.

Thank you for your e-mail.

- Will buses continue to operate out of Kennedy Station?

- Yes. The design of the Busway involves busses onboarding and off-boarding at Kennedy Station at the same location. There will be a driveway entrance made adjacent to Kennedy's former south commuter-lot, allowing buses to exit and enter the Busway. The Busway will help customers skip 15 sets of traffic lights along the corridor, providing a more efficient and reliable ride.
- Will the only change be buses on a dedicated corridor?
  - Correct. The major change is that buses will be operating on a dedicated right-of-way, where the former SRT train operated. This dedicated corridor will be between Kennedy Station and Ellesmere Station, approximately 4km in length, and the majority of the trip to Scarborough Centre Station.
- When will this change happen?
  - Busway construction is expected to begin in early-2025, and take approximately two years to complete.

The Line 3 Busway is a proposal to construct a dedicated bus corridor to replace the TTC's Line 3 Scarborough Rapid Transit (SRT) system, which was decommissioned in 2023. The Busway will provide continuous and reliable bus service in Scarborough.

#### Key Details about the Line 3 Busway:

- Route: The Busway will operate along a 4-kilometre segment of the former Line 3 right-of-way, following the same general route as the previous Line 3 service. The route will begin at Kennedy Station, with stops at Tara Avenue/Moorgate Avenue, Lawrence East Station, and Ellesmere Station. At Ellesmere Station, buses will exit the Busway and use Ellesmere Road's priority bus infrastructure to connect to Scarborough Town Centre.
- **Dedicated Infrastructure:** The Busway will feature dedicated lanes or corridors, avoiding regular traffic congestion to ensure faster and more reliable transit times for passengers.
- **Service:** Multiple TTC bus routes will use the Busway, providing frequent express service to accommodate the high passenger demand previously served by the Line 3 trains.
- Passenger Experience: While buses have a lower capacity than the former Line 3 trains, the TTC
  will increase the frequency of bus service to handle higher ridership and minimize disruptions for
  commuters.

An Environmental Project Report (EPR) is being prepared as part of the Transit and Rail Project Assessment Process (Ontario Regulation 231/08), an environmental assessment process specific to public transit projects. Thank you for taking the time to share your comments regarding the Line 3 Busway conversion early works. Work is not scheduled to begin until the last week of September – the issue date reflects the date the notice was sent to print, and internally issued. Information in the notice is accurate per the issue date – in an effort for version control. The work taking place between Q4 2024 and Q1 2025 is related to removal of track and signaling infrastructure along the corridor. While there will be noise, dust and vibration associated – this work is inevitable as the existing infrastructure within the guideway needs to be removed as the guideway is decommissioned.

## Feedback to your concerns below:

- Parking at Ellesmere and Lawrence East Station: Correct. Cumulatively, the parking available between Lawrence East and Ellesmere Stations is 158 paid spaces. Across the TTC network, there are approximately 12,500 spaces available. The TTC delivered on average 2,557,900 daily weekday trips in Q2 2024. Less than 0.5% of the TTC's customers use parking network wide.
- Tara Avenue/Mooregate Avenue Bus Stop: The bus stop here is less intrusive than a transit Station. A copy of the 60% detailed design is also available on the website, with a <u>direct link here</u>. Slide 13 shows a design overview of the Tara Avenue/Mooregate Avenue stop which has very little impact to the adjacent area.
- Why the Busway is being constructed: In 2020, the TTC conducted intensive public consultation with the public: seeking feedback on plans for a Line 3 Bus Replacement program. The vast majority of respondents recommended replacing the Line 3 Guideway with a Busway. In February 2024, City Council committed funds to construct and deliver the Busway as quickly as possible for transit users in Scarborough. TTC staff are following a City Council directive.
- Noise dust and vibration concerns:
- Contact for local and property concerns: I serve as the project contact, my contact information is provided below.
- Work Hours: Construction will not necessarily take place for 12-hours each day. The notice is advising that construction may take place during these times. Regular construction hours are 7:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m. Monday Friday. The TTC is exempt from operating within the constraints of regular construction hours the work we undertake is classified as Government Work which may take place 24/7. In an effort to work cordially as good neighbours, we are committing to make all efforts to work during regular construction hours.
- **Operating Hours:** The Line 3 Busway will mirror the same times of Line 3 train service. This is as early as 6:00 a.m. and as late as 2:00 a.m. daily.
- **Potential Crime:** The TTC works closely with the Toronto Police Service in service design. The Busway is being constructed with feedback from the Toronto Police Service using principles of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED), which is a multi-disciplinary approach to crime prevention that uses urban and architectural design.

Thank you for the opportunity to contact you regarding the above mentioned construction notice. I note that it was issued on September 9, however affected residents of the area only received it on September 16th.

For your information my residence backs onto the right-of-way and for years my family was highly impacted by the loss of enjoyment of our own backyard due to the ever increasing noise levels of the trains. We now will have an even greater issue with the worry of health issues, debris, noise, personal security as well a decline in the value of our property.

There is also the potential of our streets being used for parking due to the stop at Mooregate Ave/ Tara Ave. I believe there are only 158 parking spots in total being offered at the Lawrence and Ellesmere stations, this is not enough! As we have seen being in the vicinity of the Kennedy station residential streets will offer more convenience for drivers and they will surely take advantage of this. Our street is already congested day and night on both sides due to residences converted to rooming houses and basement apartments.

I would like to further comment/question the information provided in your notice as follows:

### What we are doing and why

Although you have addressed what you are doing, there is not sufficient information on the why . Why the urgent need to replace the LRT to a bus route? We should learn from our mistakes and not repeat them.

#### Noise, dust and vibration mitigation

I am very concerned about the dust particles etc. from tearing up decades of construction materials and the impact on our health, everything I have read acknowledges there are concerns in these areas with the only response being a wait and see approach..

What is the impact to health on constant vibration levels? I also read in your reports that potentially there could be structural damage to some residences due to the vibrations. Who will be monitoring this?

Who will be our contact for any property issues? I anticipate that my house, windows, pool, will be subject to the vibrations, heavy dirt/ dust and potentially structural damage.

In addition to potential health and air quality issues identified in your reporting it also highlights the impact to the environment, wildlife and birds. I do not see anything that addresses this other than "we will monitor".

It is unacceptable that given the global issues that you are going ahead with this project. I don't know if you are familiar with the song Paved Paradise released way back in 1970 and how relevant the lyrics are today. It speaks to environmental destruction and excessive urban development. Seems like we have not learned anything. It is not necessary to replace the LRT with buses.

## Work hours

The work hours are too long, with the noise and dust etc. for 12 hours a day and potentially Saturday, it gives no consideration to the residents, it solely addresses your work schedule, which is not acceptable.

## **Operating hours**

Please confirm the hours of operation for the Busway.

Hi Jackie,

Thank you for your e-mail. The TTC intends for the Busway to have legacy use, even after the Scarborough Subway Extension is complete. At this time, we're designing for a minimum 10-year lifespan of the Busway – which would take us into the late-2030s in reasonable service life.

Regarding the 85 – you're welcome to share feedback with me. The TTC produces an Annual Service Plan each year – this policy document is a forum for staff to present routing suggestions to the TTC Board each year. We're in between round one and round two consultation currently – with round two consultation beginning in October, and staff actively analyzing feedback from round one which wrapped up in August currently. I am the community liaison for the 2025 Annual Service Plan, happy to accept suggestions for evaluation.

Managing expectations: one of the challenges with operating bus service on Port Union for the next ~2 years is the active widening work taking place. Staff have concerns with adding service that would not be reliable, or efficient, given construction impact. A route is planned in this area once the infrastructure upgrade is completed on Port Union – this service has been planned for some time, as Port Union widening was in the planning stage for ~20 years.

Thank you for the note and kind words – responsibility where due: we made a mistake. On November 19, we decommissioned the stop at Kennedy and Ellesmere as my staff felt the stop at Midland and Ellesmere was most appropriate to align with former Line 3 routing. We quickly realized this *new* routing was not effective. We immediately restored the stop, however, internally, we have a few times each year to make routing/service changes, which occurs every six weeks or so. This is because of union contracts, and a number of service planning factors. Following the changes on November 19, the next opportunity we have to inform our drivers of a permanent change is January 7.

So in summary: we've restored the stop *temporarily*, until January 7. Beginning January 7, the stop will be permanent, and part of the official routing online, available in transit apps to track next vehicle, etc.

As a customer, you are able to use the stop today, and will be able to continue using the stop for as long as we offer the on-street line 3 replacement service. ©

- Tree removal: At this stage in the project, at 60% design, we do not have a firm number of trees or tree species which may potentially be impacted. The TTC's consultant, AECOM, recorded Norway Spruce during field investigations, refer to the <u>Appendix B- Plant List in our Natural Environment Report</u>. A tree inventory would need to be completed to determine the number of trees that might be impacted by the Project. We did not come across information regarding a tree inventory or arborist report in the background information. A tree inventory and arborist report were not prepared for the Scarborough Subway Extension 2017 EPR and 2020 EPR addendum.
- Existing bus lanes: I am sorry to hear about the concerns regarding buses on Kennedy Road and Midland Avenue. One advantage of the Busway is to relocate dozens of buses from Kennedy Road and Midland Avenue onto the Busway. Today, during peak-periods, there are over 50 buses operating along the corridor per hour. The Busway would allow these buses to use the exclusive right-of-way, off-street, rather than operating on the roadway.

• Bus emissions: The TTC is purchasing hybrid buses in a commitment to greening our fleet and some of these vehicles will operate in this corridor. These eco-friendly vehicles incorporate hybrid technology and run off power generated onboard that is fueled by diesel engines. Though the vehicles are still using fuel to produce energy, they consume up to 30 per cent less than other non-hybrid buses. We intend to assign many of these buses along the Line 3 corridor. Thank you for taking the time to review the Line 3 Busway community notice, and sharing your questions and feedback with me. Sharing some information below:

- Line 3 Busway extension from Ellesmere Station to McCowan Station
  - The scope of the Busway project currently is related to civil work proposed between a 4-kilometere portion of former Line 3 track area between Kennedy Station and Ellesmere Station. The Project will remove the existing Line 3 track and systems and replace it with a paved surface for buses to operate between three stops: Tara Avenue/ Moorgate Avenue, Lawrence East Station, and Ellesmere Station. At Ellesmere Station, buses will depart the Busway, using the existing red priority bus lanes along Ellesmere Avenue and Brimley Road to proceed to Scarborough Centre.
  - There are currently no long-term plans to extend the Busway beyond Ellesmere Station. There are technical elements to infrastructure on the elevated Line 3 right-of-way that would need significant modification to allow for vehicular traffic to use the area this was determined by staff to be cost, and time prohibitive. Particularly, the tunnel which facilitates turns between Ellesmere Station and Midland Station cannot regular 40ft buses safely, and the elevated portion of the right-of-way cannot accommodate emergency vehicles as it is to narrow.

Would it be possible to add connections to eventually have this bus way become a trail/bike way that uses all the old infrastructure? It'd connect kind of well to the future east rail path plans between near Kennedy Station and Victoria park Station. And more connections in general though pedestrian pathing. Like lord Robert's, treverton Dr are cut off from Kennedy Station and Kennedy Station is kind of isolated. Having pedestrian path bypassing and/or connecting North South to the go/ttc Station would be good. And I think this bus project would be helpful to get it done since line 5 and ever iteration of the line 3 replacement hasn't yet.

Thank you for taking the time to share your note with me. The Busway project is specifically related to civil work proposed between a 4-kilometere portion of former Line 3 track area between Kennedy Station and Ellesmere Station. The Project will remove the existing Line 3 track and systems and replace it with a paved surface for buses to operate between three stops: Tara Avenue/ Moorgate Avenue, Lawrence East Station, and Ellesmere Station. At Ellesmere Station, buses will depart the Busway, using the existing red priority bus lanes along Ellesmere Avenue and Brimley Road to proceed to Scarborough Centre.

There are currently no long-term plans to extend the Busway beyond Ellesmere Station. There are technical elements to infrastructure on the elevated Line 3 right-of-way that would need significant modification to allow for vehicular traffic to use the area – this was determined by staff to be cost, and time prohibitive. Particularly, the tunnel which facilitates turns between Ellesmere Station and Midland Station cannot regular 40ft buses safely, and the elevated portion of the right-of-way cannot accommodate emergency vehicles as it is to narrow.

Thank you for taking the time to share your feedback regarding the proposed Line 3 Busway. Sharing answers to your questions below in green.

- 1. why not reuse the entire line including the elevated section into the Scarborough Town Centre for the bus route. Is it a safety concern.
  - a. The eastbound turn between Ellesmere Station and Midland Station prior to the right-of-way going above grade occurs in a tunnel. This tunnel is too narrow to accommodate standard 40ft buses. Reconfiguration of the tunnel to accommodate buses was considered and presented to City Council in 2013, however was cost prohibitive.
  - b. There are safety concerns related to emergency vehicle access and overall transportation safety with operating buses on an elevated right-of-way which was not designed for standard bus traffic. The existing right-of-way is quite narrow.
- 2. Could the tracks be relaid to accommodate regular or shorter street cars to the town centre.
  - a. A proposal to refit the existing Line 3 track with new trains (rolling-stock) was proposed to City Council in 2013. City Council, and subsequently the Province of Ontario opted to replace existing Line 3 infrasturcture with the Scarborough Subway Extension. Refitting Line 3 with new rolling stock now, along with undertaking extensive signaling and infrastructure enhancements would be cost prohibitive.
- 3. Is the intent to demolish the existing elevated portion if the bus route ends at Ellesmere?
  - a. Earlier this year, City Council directed City-staff to begin Exploring Innovative Adaptive Reuse of the Scarborough Rapid Transit Elevated Guideway and Assets. More on this request is available here: <u>Agenda Item History - 2024.MM16.7 (toronto.ca)</u>. As per Council's request: staff will report back to City Council by the end of the fourth quarter of 2024.
- 4. If ending at Ellesmere, could the elevated section be converted to a pedestrian walkway with bicycle lanes and additional access from ground level.
  - a. This will be part of the City of Toronto's evaluation of the future of the elevated right-of-way, per the study mentioned above.

Thank you for taking the time to share your feedback. Ultimately, the Busway is the directive that City Council and the TTC Board opted to proceed with to serve as a replacement for Line 3 train service. Happy to accept any feedback on the existing proposal per the environmental assessment report. We will also be hosting a public open house in September about the project, and will certainly share an invitation to attend shortly.


