

# **Greenwood Station Easier Access Project**

Enter Greenwood Station from Bus Loop to Side Doors

Temporary front door closure to install accessible doors, structural and electrical upgrades

### Starting as early as January 30, 2024 up to Spring 2024\*

\* Content/timeline accurate at the time of printing. Pending weather, possible third-party union strikes and unforeseen site events.

## What we are doing and why:

Greenwood Station is part of the TTC's Easier Access Program, which includes making the station accessible with the construction of two new elevators. Currently, excavation for both elevators has been completed, and construction for the elevators shaft is continuing. Elevators are scheduled to be in service in mid-2025.\* \*Pending weather, third-party union strikes, and unforeseen site conditions and events.

### Temporary Station Entry through Bus Loop

In order to build new, accessible sliding doors for the front entrance, TTC has to temporarily divert the main entrance to the bus loop. Customers will temporarily enter the station from the bus loop through side doors. Work to install new, accessible front entrance sliding doors involves demolition, and additional structural, electrical, and glazing upgrades.

### What to expect:

- A path within the bus loop (from Linnsmore Crescent) will be provided to allow customers to access the Station during the above-noted period via the side doors.
- Customer detour/signage will be in place.
- There will be no disruption to subway service at Greenwood Station for this work.
- Protective hoarding will be provided at the main entrance/exit to facilitate this work.
- For safety reasons, some work and the initial set-up and removal of the access area will occur overnight through the entrance doors at the station
- Majority of the work will take place between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, and on Saturday after 9 a.m., with work after hours and on Sunday after 9 a.m. if required. Some overnight work will be required during the course of this project for safety and efficiency.
