- TTC Board members are considered directors of a corporation and should be aware of the TTC's SH&E Management System and its performance

COVID-19 PANDEMIC

- On March 17, 2020, Ontario declared a state of emergency and implemented mandatory measures to control the spread of COVID-19
- This resulted in the closure of non-essential businesses, schools and child cares, as well as recommendations to work from home where possible
- These measures had a significant impact on TTC ridership and traffic volume,
 which impacted customer injury rates and collision rates during the review period
- The TTC continues to implement control measures for the protection of its workers, customers and the public in accordance with public health guidance
