SUBJECT: TTC SECURITY PLAN

ACTION ITEM

REASON FOR CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

This report involves the security of property belonging to the Commission.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Commission:

1. Endorse the information as set out in the Confidential Attachment 1; and
2. Note that the confidential information as set out in Confidential Attachment 1 remain confidential in its entirety as it contains information that involves the security of property belonging to the Commission.

BACKGROUND

In April 2009, City Council adopted their City-wide Security Plan including a revised Corporate Security framework and Corporate Security Policy. City Council requested that all Agencies, Boards and Commissions with dedicated security management, including the Toronto Transit Commission, apply the security framework and report to the Commission regarding their own security plan.

In July 2009, Transport Canada released their Code of Practice on Developing and Maintaining Security Plans for Rail and Transit Operators. The TTC participated in the development of the Code as a member of Transport Canada's Security Standards Development Committee.

The 2010 TTC Security Plan updates the previous 2007 TTC System Security Plan that was received and endorsed at the March 21, 2007 TTC Committee of the Whole meeting. The 2010 Plan is similar to the 2007 version but is more detailed consistent with content requirements outlined in Transport Canada's Code of Practice.

The 2010 update of the TTC Security Plan is in keeping with the City's Corporate Security framework and the Transport Canada Code of Practice.

DISCUSSION

The TTC has implemented a comprehensive program of security responsibilities, activities

and measures which are documented in the TTC Security Plan. The goal of the TTC Security Plan is to enhance the level of security and protection afforded to TTC employees, customers and assets from various security threats including terrorism, crime and disorder. Future updates of the Plan will be forwarded to the Commission for information and endorsement.

JUSTIFICATION

It is in the Commission's best interests to be supportive of a comprehensive security program in order to adequately protect TTC customers, employees and assets, and to be aware of and endorse TTC Security Plan updates.
