SUBJECT: TTC PENSION FUND SOCIETY BYLAW AMENDMENT

**ACTION ITEM** 

### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Commission approve the attached Bylaw Amendment to the Bylaws of the Toronto Transit Commission Pension Fund Society.

#### **BACKGROUND**

At its meeting on May 28, 2012, the Board of Directors of the TTC PFS approved the attached benefit changes affecting both active employees and retired members. Subject to Commission approval of this bylaw amendment and ratification by the membership at the Annual General Meeting to be held on June 16, 2012, the Board approved: (1) a one-year update to the Base Period such that the year 2008 can now be included in the Base Period and (2) a 1% ad hoc indexing on existing pensions. As per the Bylaws of the TTC PFS, all benefit changes resulting in a bylaw amendment require approval of the TTC PFS Board, the Commission and the membership.
