## **BACKGROUND**

In 2002, TTC investigated a sub-surface environmental condition on the former Lansdowne Bus Garage property, ("Lansdowne property"), and discovered trichloroethylene ("TCE") in soil and groundwater beneath the site. Considerable investigations were conducted and the Ministry of Environment consulted. These investigations led to the TTC concluding that a likely source of the TCE was from an up gradient property (224 Wallace Avenue), formerly owned by General Electric Canada Inc. (GE) and now owned by Bilnia Investments Limited. In 2005, TTC initiated a lawsuit against GE and Bilnia.
