As a retiree who regularly rides the TTC system at all times of the day and evening, I appreciate the suggestion to charge me only \$1 to ride during the off-peak hours.

However, I really don't need this help. The current ticket price of \$1.90 is valid at any time, and is quite affordable for me and my husband.

The new low-price ticket should not be age-based at all. Not all students have to prove their age, to get their concessionary fare, and they are not limited in their travel times.

You should consider helping all those on low incomes, like recipients of Ontario Works payments or those on GIS pensions, who can produce evidence of their need. Travelling cheaply only in the off-peak hours is not helpful when people have jobs to go to, however low-paying, day-care to get to, or medical appointments to attend.

Some people in need of low fares are homeless with extremely limited incomes from panhandling or charitable assistance – they need help too.
