

- Stop consolidation: fewer stops, faster and more reliable service

Jane Street

- **Phase One:** Develop goals and prioritization plan for top five corridors (complete)
- **Phase Two:** Evaluate corridor designs, select preferred design, consult the public and begin assembling baseline data
- **Phase Three:** Implement and monitor
- **Target implementation:** Spring 2021



| Next steps

- **July/August**
 - City report to July Executive Committee and Council
 - Consult with customers on service concept for Eglinton East
- **Fall**
 - STNIS study will report back to Council on a timeline for the remaining three corridors and Lawrence East
 - Customer and Stakeholder consultation activities for Jane Street
 - Eglinton East status updates in CEO report
- **December**
 - Report back to the Board and City Council with a recommended design and detailed implementation plan for Jane Street
