TTC streetcar track renewal King Street East and Church Street Delivery of new streetcar rail, staff trailer, generator, and portable washrooms

Timeline: July 4, 2025, to July 8, 2025, overnight *Content/timeline accurate at the time of printing – subject to change

Rail delivery and storage details

The City of Toronto and TTC will begin the streetcar track renewal phase of the King Street East and Church Street intersection construction the week of **July 7**, **2025**. To support this work, from July 4 to 8, the TTC will begin delivering new streetcar rail panels to the site *overnight*, between 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. The rail panels will be delivered on 9 flat-deck trailers in total for eventual installation at the intersection. The trailers will be parked in the centre lanes on each leg of the King Street East and Church Street intersection (see the map on the reverse of this page). The trailers will be removed once the new rail is installed at the intersection.

Staff trailer, generator, and portable washroom delivery details

In addition, two TTC crew site trailers, a generator, and portable washrooms will be delivered to the work site around **July 7**, **2025**. This equipment will be placed on the north curb lane of King Street East, west of Jarvis Street, outside of the current fenced construction area. The generator will need to run 24 hours a day to support the around-the-clock track work. The items will be removed ahead of the King/Church intersection re-opening, which is anticipated for mid-August 2025.

Noise

While crews delivering these items will try to keep noise to a minimum, beeping sounds from backup alarms on trucks and equipment will be audible. Equipment lights may also be noticeable.

Travel and parking impacts

While local traffic will continue to be permitted within the existing road closure area, only eastbound access will be permitted on King Street East between Oak Hall Lane and west of Jarvis Street starting July 7, 2025. This is because flat-bed trailers containing new rail will be occupying the centre lanes on King Street East, and the other equipment will be placed on the north curb lane on King Street East as well. The TTC expects to have these trailers removed and two-way traffic restored by July 14, 2025.


